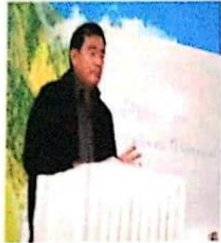



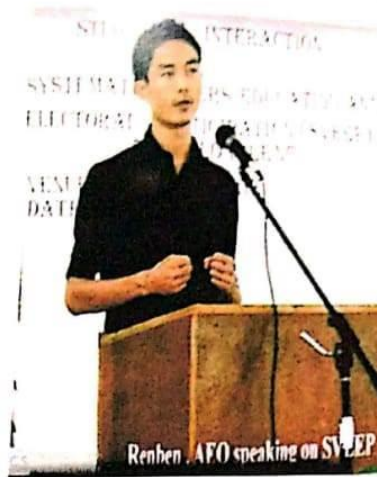

Dr. M.K. Jha, expressing his view on the said topic said that demonetization is a process of removing a currency from general use. The old currency will be replaced with a new currency. The Indian Government decided to demonetize the 500 and 1000 rupee note w.e.f. November 8, 2016. The following points were highlighted by him:-

1. The main motive of this decision was to eradicate the black money.
2. It helps to eliminate Fake Indian Currency Notes.
3. It helps the government to track people who are having large amount of unaccounted cash or cash on which no income tax has been paid.
4. New Taxpayers were detected and Tax base of the country was increased.
5. It will curb terrorist activities as black money is the major source of terrorism.
6. As its negative impact it was seen that there were long queue outside bank and ATM.
7. Village & semi-urban area people were most affected as the majority of transactions are made through cash.

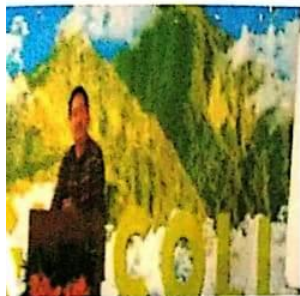

Shmt. Henow Chingzong highlighted that the Nagas have a rich tradition of art and craft rooted in a lifestyle. Skilled tribal craftsman and artisans have always been the pillars of a tribal society that had, for many centuries, been self-sufficient. They lent their skills to creating items of utility as well those with ritualistic and aesthetic value. She said that the various crafts and art that were known to the early Nagas, are still carried out to this day like bamboo works, weaving, embroidery, wood carvings, basketry, traditional ornaments, painting, mats making, cane works, pottery, decorative items etc. The local indigenous inhabitants of Nagaland are master in the making of all these items and they can earn money out of its selling.

Shri Chingdam Mukho said in his speech that the tribal handicrafts are specialized skills



which are passed on from one generation to another and these handicrafts are means of livelihood of the artisans. Handicrafts have great potential and this sector occupies a prime sector in building up the economy of the individual as well as the state. Nagaland is hosting every year the 'Nagaland Buyer -Seller Meet' during Hornbill festival at Kohima. However, establishment of common facilities centres for imparting training, marketing, providing market intelligence,

establishing linkages with financial institutions, providing raw materials, providing managerial inputs etc are the need of the hour. The Programme was ended with the vote of thanks presented by Dr. Toli Achumi.






### LEGAL AWARENESS PROGRAMME 2018





**Report on World Blood Donor Day- 2018**


**Report on Awareness & Sensitization Programme on Water Conservation - Jal Shakti Abhiyan**
