The first International Women's Day started because women had been suffering, subordinated by men and they had no right in the political, social and economic fields. As a result they voiced out for their rights. The first International Women's Day occurred on 19 March 1911, which included rallies and organized meetings in countries like Austria, Germany and Denmark. The 19 March was chosen because it commemorated the day that the Prussian King promised to introduce votes for equality but it was a promise that failed to keep. The International Women's Day date was moved to March 8 in 1913. The UN drew global attention to women's concern in 1975 by calling for an international year. Women's Day is celebrated to proclaim for women's rights and world peace and recognized women's achievement without regard to division. All together 60 students attended the programme.






Jal Shakti Abhiyan
